

Fiske Boulevard (S.R. 519) Resurfacing

From the Northbound I-95 Ramps/Barnes Boulevard to King Street (S.R. 520)

Brevard County

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is finalizing the design of a project to resurface all travel lanes of Fiske Boulevard (State Road (S.R.) 519) from the northbound Interstate 95 (I-95) ramps to King Street (S.R. 520) in the cities of Rockledge and Cocoa.

In addition to placing new pavement, the project calls for creating 6-foot-wide buffered bicycle lanes in both directions.

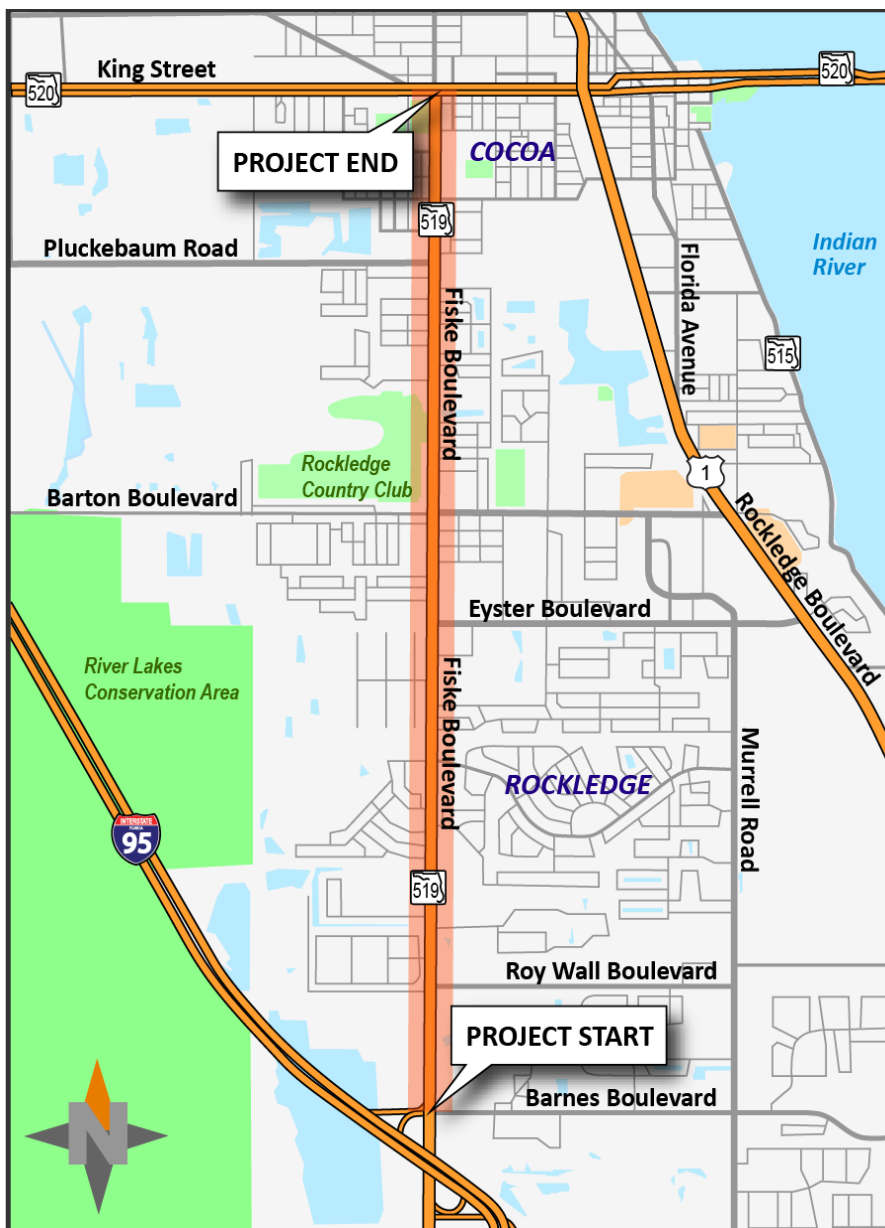
The roadway will continue to have two through lanes in each direction, and existing turn lanes will be maintained.

Pedestrian improvements include new crosswalks, upgraded pedestrian curb ramps and pedestrian lighting, as well as construction of a new sidewalk to close gaps. Drainage adjustments, new signing and pavement markings, and other necessary roadside improvements are also planned.

Design of the project is expected to finish in summer 2020, with construction anticipated to begin in spring 2021 at an estimated cost of approximately \$8.7 million.
