Welcome to the first edition of the U.S. 17 Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Newsletter! The purpose of this newsletter is to share information and let you know that the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is conducting a study in your area. As shown on the project location map below, the study involves a new multiuse trail along U.S. 17 from State Road (S.R.) 40 to the Volusia/Putnam County line, just north of Seville.

### **Project Overview**

This study, known as a Project Development and Environment Study, is part of an effort to complete the St. Johns River to Sea (SJR2C) Loop - a 260-mile multi-use trail

system that connects Volusia, Putnam, St. Johns, Flagler, Volusia, and Brevard counties.

The purpose of this study is to evaluate a multi-use trail that meets the objectives of the FDOT Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Program, described in greater detail below. The need for this project is to provide pedestrian and bicycle accommodations for local and regional users by providing a multi-use trail that fills a key gap in the planned five-county SJR2C Trail. During the PD&E Study, the FDOT will evaluate the impacts of developing the trail, as well as take the first steps toward designing the trail and determining its alignment (placement of the trail).

### **Continuing the Trail**

South of S.R. 40, a multi-use trail is being designed as part of the four-lane widening of U.S. 17 between Ponce DeLeon Springs Boulevard and S.R. 40 (FPID # 410251-1). The segment of the SJR2C along U.S. 17 north of the Volusia/Putnam County line is anticipated to be studied in the future.

### Florida SUN Trail Program

This project is part of the statewide goal of supporting the transportation and recreational needs of bicyclists and pedestrians. As such, the State of Florida is dedicating \$25 million annually to the development of a statewide network of multi-use trails. Currently, the SJR2C Loop is a top priority. #### What is a Multi-Use Trail?

A paved, shared use path, typically 12 feet wide. Trails are meant for non-motorized travel, such as by pedestrians and bicyclists.





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
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## What is a PD&E Study?

A PD&E Study is part of a planning process that evaluates the social, natural, cultural, and physical impacts of proposed transportation improvements, in this case a multiuse trail along U.S. 17 between S.R. 40 and the Volusia/Putnam County line north of Seville. The PD&E Study process, which addresses state and federal requirements, is a combination of transportation planning, engineering evaluations, environmental analysis, and public involvement. The design should be finalized in fiscal year 2021. The remaining phases (right of way and construction) are not currently funded.
