The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Five will present the proposed alternatives developed for the St. Johns River to Sea Loop Trail Gap from Lake Beresford Park to Grand Avenue in DeLand, Volusia County.

This public meeting gives interested people the opportunity to express their views about the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study and the proposed alternatives for the St. Johns River to Sea Loop Trail Gap.

The public meeting will be an open house format with a continuous presentation looping throughout the meeting to provide you with a complete overview of the project. You are welcome to attend anytime between 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Project staff will be available to discuss the project, receive your comments and answer your questions. Comment forms will also be available for documentation of public input.

### Project Overview

The St. Johns River to Sea Loop is a 260-mile trail system that will link together several communities including St. Augustine, Daytona Beach, Titusville, DeLand, and Palatka. The PD&E study is evaluating options for a multi-use trail that will close the 3.6-mile gap between existing trails terminating within Lake Beresford Park to the south and at the junction of Grand Avenue and Minnesota Avenue to the north.

FDOT is conducting a PD&E Study to perform a combination of engineering and environmental analysis along with public outreach to develop a multi-use trail option that meets the transportation need while minimizing impacts.

Funding for the design phase is included in fiscal year 2020 of the FDOT's Adopted Five-Year Work Program. There is currently no funding for the construction phase of this project.
