## SR 464 Over CSX Railroad

### Improvement Project

## Project Description

In December 2007, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Five, will begin an Improvement Project on State Road 464 over the CSX Transportation railroad from 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue to US 441/US 27/US 301 (Pine Avenue). This project involves constructing a four-lane, two-way overpass on SR 464 (SW 17<sup>th</sup> Street) over the CSX Transportation railroad and two-lane, two-way service roads on SR 464 to provide access to adjacent development. The project shall extend from approximately 800 feet west of the intersection of SR 464 with SW 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue east to the west side of the intersection of SR 464 with US 441/US 301/ US27 (Pine Avenue).

This project includes:

- New right-turn lane for eastbound SR 464 to southbound US 301/US 441/US 27
- A temporary crossing of the CSX railroad
- Bridge construction
- New sidewalk
- Drainage system improvements
- New traffic signals and signage
- Milling and resurfacing

This project will last approximately 650 calendar days, weather permitting and cost approximately \$24.5 million. Work will be done in phases to minimize construction-related impacts to area businesses and the traveling public.

## Project Phases

**Initial Construction** includes selective clearing, grubbing and utility relocations.

**Phase IA** includes construction of the temporary grade crossings and related frontage roads on both sides of the CSX railroad tracks.

**Phase IB** includes construction of remainder of the frontage roads on both sides of SR 464 and construction of proposed ponds.

**Phase II** includes construction of bridge, roadway construction and wall construction.

## Speed Limits

The speed limits during construction should be maintained as follows:

- Existing posted speed limits will remain in place.

## Traffic Flow

This project includes a detailed Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) Plan that will maintain traffic flow through the construction zone. Lane closures will be necessary at various times and locations in order for workers to complete this work safely. However, lane closures are restricted to non-peak hours, which are:

**9 p.m.-6 a.m.**

Access to residences and businesses will be maintained at all times. Should it be necessary to close a driveway to perform project-related work, project personnel will coordinate with the property owner in advance.

## Always Put Safety First

For your safety and the safety of others, please use extreme caution and be alert when driving, walking, or biking around any construction area.

The Department strives to minimize construction-related impacts; however, you may experience one or more of the following while traveling through the project area:

- Lane closures and/or detours
- Median closures
- Reduced speed limits
- Dust and noise
- Heavy equipment and personnel moving in and around work zones.
