S.R. 3 from S.R. 528 to Kennedy Space Center

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is making roadway improvements to North Courtenay Parkway (State Road (S.R.) 3) from the S.R. 528 access ramps to the Kennedy Space Center Gate in Merritt Island. The work will consist of resurfacing the northbound and southbound travel lanes, along with median widening to accommodate new traffic separating concrete islands. Workers will also reconstruct sidewalks, and install 4-foot-wide bicycle lanes.

Southbound left turn lanes will be extended near the intersections of Hall Road, Gator Drive, and Grant/Smith Road. Northbound left turn lanes will be extended near the intersections of Hall Road. Duval Street, and Grant/Smith Road. New northbound and southbound left turn lanes will be constructed just north of Duval Street and just south of Sunset Lakes Drive.

Other improvements include pedestrian signal upgrades to comply with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, guardrail enhancements, intersection lighting, Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) upgrades, and drainage modifications.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Throughout the duration of the project, motorists should expect lane closures from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. and from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Weekend lane closures are unrestricted and may happen anytime during the day or night.

Uneven pavement is a common, unavoidable roadway condition with resurfacing projects as the contractor must put down different layers of asphalt during various phases of construction. Motorists are asked to use extra caution while driving through the work zone. Road conditions during construction are short-term and will become less apparent as the project progresses.
