

I-95 Interchange at Viera Boulevard

Brevard County

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will construct a new diverging diamond interchange (DDI) on Interstate 95 (I-95) at Viera Boulevard. The interchange will help to reduce congestion and improve safety.

This will be the third DDI in Florida and the second in Brevard County. Diverging diamond interchanges are sometimes called crisscross interchanges because they eliminate the need to turn left across traffic. Instead, vehicles trade sides as interstate traffic enters or exits with a slight curve. Since the number of potential conflicts between drivers is reduced, safety for the traveling public is increased. This new design is also as safe as a traditional interchange for pedestrians and bicyclists. Construction is scheduled to begin in November.

This project also includes:

- Milling and resurfacing of Viera Boulevard to tie into the new I-95 entrance and exit ramps;
- Installation of an Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) that includes overhead electronic sign displays, vehicle detection and closed-circuit television;
- Improvements to lighting and drainage at and around the interchange.
