



I-95 Resurfacing from Citrus Boulevard to the Addison Canal

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) plans to resurface a segment of Interstate 95 (I-95) from Citrus Boulevard to the Addison Canal between Cocoa and Titusville in Brevard County.

The purpose of this project is to resurface the asphalt to maintain a safe and reliable driving surface and extend the service life of the roadway.

The project plans to resurface all travel lanes, shoulders, and ramps in both directions along the corridor, including the ramps at the State Road (S.R.) 407 and the Port St. John Parkway interchanges. In addition, FDOT is updating existing curb ramps at Port St. John Parkway to comply with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards and upgrading some sections of the existing guardrail along the corridor to enhance safety.
