

S.R. 60 Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study

From Prairie Lake Road to Florida's Turnpike

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is conducting a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for State Road (S.R.) 60 from Prairie Lake Road to Florida's Turnpike in Osceola County. The goal of the study is to address future travel demand and improve safety along the 19.3-mile corridor.

This project is evaluating the widening of S.R. 60 from two to four lanes, to strengthen east-west regional connectivity across Polk, Osceola, and Indian River counties, and improve the overall safety and operation of S.R. 60.

Alternatives Evaluated

The PD&E Study is evaluating two alternatives:

- No Build Alternative Maintains the existing conditions and includes planned projects in the study area
- Build Alternative Widens the roadway to four lanes (two lanes in each direction) through the study limits

The PD&E Study will look at the widening of S.R. 60 in two segments:


Segment 1: Prairie Lake Road to Kenansville Road (U.S. 441)

- Widen to 4-lane rural divided highway
- Shift alignment to the north
- 65 mph speed limit

Segment 2: Kenansville Road to Florida's Turnpike

- Widen to 4-lane urban divided highway
- Centered alignment
- 45 mph speed limit

The study evaluates traffic and safety along with the potential impacts and enhancements to the natural, social, cultural, and physical environments associated with all evaluations during this PD&E Study.
