PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is making roadway improvements on U.S. 17-92 (South Orlando Drive) from north of Lake Mary Boulevard to north of Airport Boulevard. The existing right turn lanes on U.S. 17-92 will be extended to create continuous outside turn lanes. This will improve access to businesses and residential properties. Additionally, the existing four travel lanes will be resurfaced to improve driving conditions, and pedestrian hybrid beacons (PHBs) will be placed at two adjacent crosswalks approximately 1,000 feet north of Americana Boulevard on U.S. 17-92 (see map below) to improve safety for pedestrians crossing the road.

Changes will also be made to the U.S. 17-92 and Airport Boulevard intersection (see map below), including resurfacing, upgrading the traffic signals, widening on the northeast corner to add an additional westbound continuous right turn lane, and restriping the eastbound lanes to create an additional right turn lane. These additions will help improve the flow of traffic through the intersection.

WHAT TO EXPECT

This project will require intermittent lane closures during nighttime hours. Additionally, there will be intermittent nighttime closures of the southbound State Road (S.R.) 417 on ramp. Traffic will be detoured to

Airport Boulevard to access southbound S.R. 417. Electronic message boards and other signage will be used to alert motorists. The contractor will maintain access to sidewalks, businesses and residences during construction. The construction schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions. Please be advised it is the property owner's responsibility to remove or relocate any privately owned irrigation, landscaping, decorations, and/or fencing within FDOT right of way before the start of construction.
