



NE 36th Avenue Widening

From NE 20th Place to north of NE 25th Street in Ocala

Marion County

Financial Project Identification (FPID): 431798-3

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is widening NE 36th Avenue in Ocala from two to four lanes between NE 20th Place and north of NE 25th Street. The project also calls for construction of two new bridges: one over the CSX railroad crossing and the other over a new access road that will be built. Work will also include: clearing land, realigning NE 24th and NE 25th streets, ponds, new turn lanes at multiple locations, bicycle lanes, sidewalks, 20-foot-wide grassed medians and concrete medians near the bridges, drainage, light and signalization improvements, various pedestrian features to comply with the current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, and updated signage and pavement markings.

What to Expect

- Construction activities will require nighttime lane closures and detours.
- Flaggers will be present during lane closures to help direct traffic along the road as well as with accessing driveways and side streets.
- Work at the intersection with 21st Street will require multiple, temporary detours. Traffic will be directed during the detour times to use NE 39th Avenue, 14th Street, and NE 30th Avenue.

Safety

Motorists should be aware that existing speed limits will not be changed. Electronic message boards and other signs will be installed to provide advance lane closure notice to bicyclists, drivers, and pedestrians. Signage, structures, and flaggers will help to safely direct all road users around work.

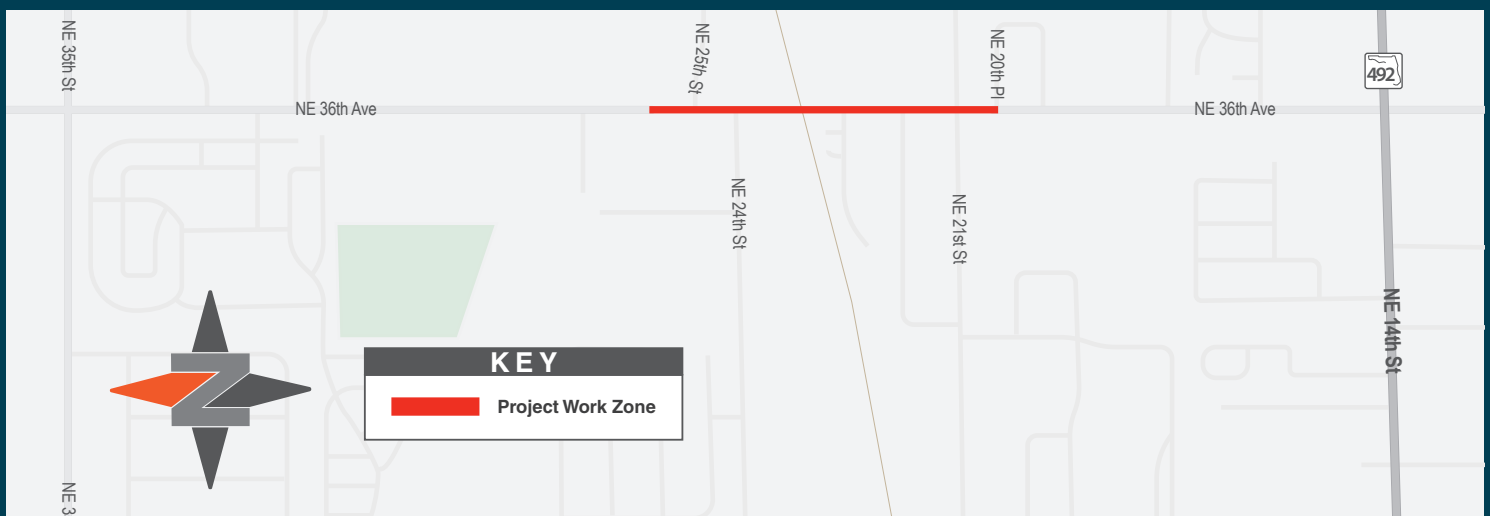
