RESURFACING AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

S.R. 442 (Indian River Boulevard) from I-95 to U.S. 1 (South Ridgewood Avenue)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will resurface State Road (S.R.) 442 (Indian River Boulevard) from Interstate 95 (I-95) to U.S. 1 (South Ridgewood Avenue) in Volusia County and implement roadway safety improvements, including wrong way driving detection at the I-95 and S.R. 442 Interchange.

This project will also include the construction of a 12-foot-wide asphalt shared use path adjacent to eastbound S.R. 442 from I-95 to west of Air Park Road. The shared use path will be physically separated from the vehicle travel lanes of S.R. 442 and can be safely utilized by bicyclists, pedestrians, skaters, runners, and other non-motorists. The shared use path will connect to the East Central Regional Rail Trail near Cow Creek Road. A 6-foot-wide sidewalk will also be constructed adjacent to westbound S.R. 442 from just east of I-95 to west of Air Park Road. These improvements will enhance safety, mobility, and accessibility for all users.

Additional safety enhancements include new buffered bicycle lanes on the roadway from just west of Air Park Road to U.S. 1, new pedestrian curb ramps and sidewalk reconstruction to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. Work also includes new pedestrian lighting, traffic signal improvements, and drainage upgrades.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Motorists should expect intermittent single lane closures on eastbound and westbound S.R. 442 during construction. This project will also require brief ramp closures at the I-95 and S.R. 442 interchange. Electronic message boards and other signage will be used to alert motorists of closures and detours

Uneven pavement is a common, unavoidable roadway condition with projects that require resurfacing, as the contractor must place different layers of asphalt during various phases of construction. Motorists are asked to exercise caution and reduce their speed while driving through the work zone. The contractor will maintain pedestrian access to sidewalks during construction using signed detours, traffic control devices, and/or temporary walkways and ramps, when appropriate.
