

PROJECT BACKGROUND

U.S. 441 Access Management

Dajana Gibson, the Project Consultant, will review the proposed design concept for U.S. 441.



This design project is located within the City of Leesburg in Lake County, Florida; beginning at Griffin Road and ending at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.



Existing Conditions

- U.S. 441
 - 7 lanes (six travel lanes plus two-way continuous left turn lane)
 - 4 traffic signals (Griffin Road, Bealls Shopping Center, Picciola Road, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard)
 - Evacuation route
- Lake County Public Schools
 - Crossing guards at Griffin Road
 - o 1 bus stop on U.S. 441 (north of Key Scale Ford)
- LakeXpress Bus Stops (Route 1A)
 - 12 stops along U.S. 441 (six northbound & six southbound)


Today, U.S. 441 is a 7-lane roadway with six travel lanes plus a center two-way, continuous left turn lane.

For this stretch of U.S. 441, there are 4 traffic signals, which are located at: Griffin Road, the Bealls Shopping Center, Picciola Road, and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

U.S. 441 also serves as an evacuation route.

There are 2 school crossing guards at the Griffin Road/U.S. 441 intersection for students attending nearby Beverly Shores Elementary School (to the east) and Carver Middle School (to the west). There is 1 school bus stop on U.S. 441, just north of Key Scale Ford.

LakeXpress Route 1A has 12 bus stops along U.S. 441; 6 northbound and 6 southbound.



Currently, this part of U.S. 441 has a total of six travel lanes; three in each direction. Each lane is 11 feet wide.

In the middle, there is a two-way, continuous left turn lane which is 11 feet wide.

The sidewalks are each 5 feet wide. While there are no bicycle lanes on this segment of U.S. 441, cyclists may use nearby alternate facilities.




Project Need

- Access Management Study (June 2018)
 - o 384 crashes on U.S. 441, from 2011 through 2015
 - 151 injuries and 5 fatalities
- Study Recommendations
 - Replace the continuous two-way left turn lane with a raised median
 - o Include auxiliary left turn lanes at directions or full median openings
 - Design and then construct

U.S. 441 Access Management


The need for this design project was identified in the Access Management Study completed in June 2018. From 2011 through 2015, there were 384 crashes on this section of U.S. 441, accounting for 151 injuries and 5 fatalities.

Based on these findings, the study recommended that access management and safety improvements are needed on U.S. 441 by replacing the center 2-way, continuous left turn lane with a raised median.




Access management is the careful planning of the location, design, and operations of driveways, median openings, interchanges, and street connections.

The intent is to separate conflict points by providing a reasonable distance between driveways and between median openings.



Conflict points are places where two vehicles could legally cross paths and potentially collide.



A key component of access management is to reduce the number of potential conflict points.

For example, a four-leg intersection (shown on the left) has 18 crossing or left-turn conflict points. Each conflict point is a location where a crash can occur.

A two-way directional median (shown on the right) reduces the crossing conflict points to 4.



Access Management


- Spacing of median openings based on roadway characteristics
- Full median openings for this project will be 1,320 feet apart (1/4 mile)
- Directional median openings are proposed to be 660 feet apart on this project


Spacing of median openings is based on characteristics of the specific roadway. In this case, on U.S. 441, there will be 1,320 feet (or $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile) between full median openings and 660 feet (or $\frac{1}{8}$ - mile) between directional median openings.




Let's review the proposed roadway features, or typical section, for U.S. 441, from Griffin Road to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

The existing two-way, continuous left turn lane (in the middle of the roadway) is 11-feet wide and will be replaced with a 13-foot raised median.


The new median will have full or directional openings.



There will continue to be six travel lanes. In each direction, the middle and outside lanes will be 11 feet wide (as they are today). The inside lanes (in each direction) will be 10-feet wide.




There will continue to be a 5-foot wide sidewalk on each side of the road.



Using this new typical section, here are the proposed access and safety changes along U.S. 441.

- The project begins at the intersection at Griffin Road, which will continue to have a traffic signal.
- Today, there is a full median opening at Griffin Road and that will continue to be there.
- The raised median will begin north of this intersection at Ramshackle Café.
- The directional median opening at the Chevron driveway will allow left turns if you are traveling north on U.S. 441.
- The other directional median will allow left turns from southbound U.S. 441 onto N. Shore Drive.



As you travel north along U.S. 441 and you want to make a left turn onto Akron Road, you will need to go past this intersection and make a U-turn at the traffic signal at Rural King and the Bealls Shopping Center, which will continue to have a traffic signal.

A directional median opening will be at Tally Road. You will be able to make all turning movements with one exception. To go north on U.S. 441 from Tally Road, you will need to go south on U.S. 441 and make a U-turn at the Rural King traffic signal.

In addition, you will be able to only make right turns "in and out of" the Lake County Tax Collector's office and at Georgia Avenue.



Several safety improvements are proposed at the intersection with Picciola Road.


- The right turn lane on U.S. 441 will be reconfigured to slow down drivers as they make a right turn onto Picciola Road.
- A crosswalk will be added along the southern leg of the intersection.
- All four strain poles will be replaced and new pedestrian signals will be added.

All turning movements that can be done today will continue to be allowed once the improvements are in place.



North of Picciola Road,

- Directional median openings will be at Eureka Avenue and Indian Trail.
- A full median opening will be at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, which will continue to have a traffic signal.
- The driveways for the area businesses (including the Aldi Shopping Center) will be "right in" and "right out" only.



All of these improvements will be available to review as one file on cflroads.com by October $16^{\rm th}$.



The proposed design solutions have also been reviewed with local stakeholders during two agency coordination meetings.
