

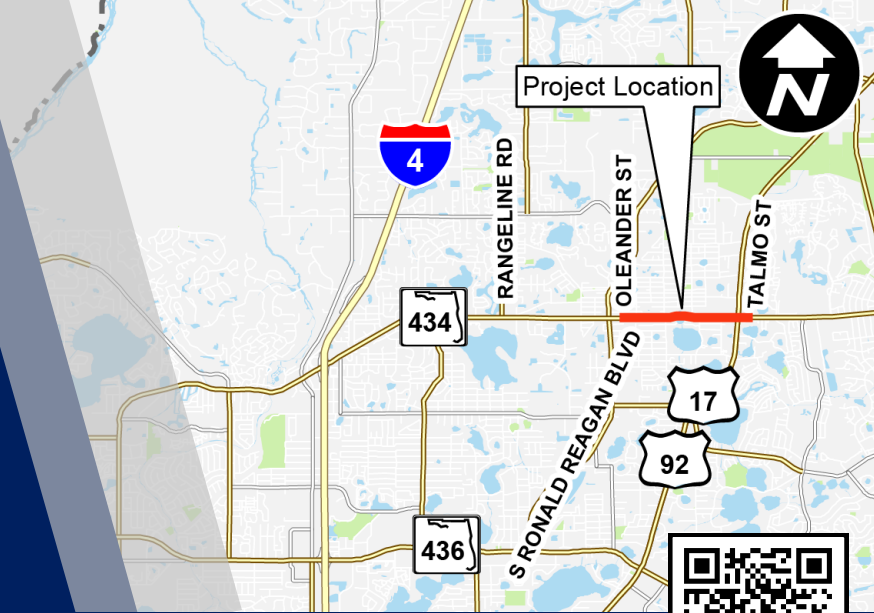


S.R. 434 Safety Improvements

from west of Oleander Street to east of East Street

Seminole County

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is planning improvements to enhance safety and improve traffic operations along State Road (S.R.) 434 from west of Oleander Street to east of East Street in Longwood. The project proposes to replace the existing center two-way left turn with a raised median and constructing wider U-turn areas at various locations.

The median will have full and directional openings in some locations, which have not yet been determined. A directional median opening allows traffic to turn right or left from S.R. 434 onto side streets, while side street traffic must turn right onto S.R. 434 and make U-turns to travel in the opposite direction. This configuration reduces the chances of angle and left-turn crashes, which can result in the most serious injuries.

The project also plans to reconstruct the traffic signals and add pedestrian signals at the S.R. 434 intersections with Grant and Wayman streets. Other safety improvements include reconstructing pedestrian curb ramps in accordance with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. The project will be constructed with the resurfacing project from east of Rangeline Road to west of Talmo Street (FPID: 441015-1).
