## Public Information Meeting for SR 19 Little Lake Harris Bridge Replacement

**Tavares** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is holding a public meeting regarding the State Road (S.R.) 19 Little Lake Harris Bridge design-build project.

The \$22 million project will consist of the removal of the existing two-lane bridge and the construction of a new two-lane bridge with 10-foot wide shoulders and an 8-foot wide sidewalk. Work is slated to begin summer of 2017.

The meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 18, 2017, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Adventure Christian Church located at 3701 N. Eichelberger Road, Tavares, Florida 32788. The meeting is an informal open house where plans will be available for review and project staff will be available to address questions.
