

## **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

State Road (S.R.) 15/600 U.S. 17/92 at the Railroad Crossing South of Orange Avenue Safety Improvements - Median Modifications Civic Center of Winter Park 1050 W. Morse Boulevard, Winter Park, FL 32789 Thursday, August 10, 2017 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.



The Florida Department of Transportation will conduct a Public Hearing regarding plans to improve safety adjacent to the railroad crossing on S.R. 15/600 (U.S. 17/92), south of Orange Avenue, in Winter Park, Orange County. The project addresses operational and safety concerns surrounding the crossing by installing a raised grassed median along S.R. 15/600 (U.S. 17/92), from the railroad crossing to 100 feet north and south of the crossing. These modifications reduce traffic conflict points at the intersections, improving safety. Additional information will be available at the public hearing related to pavement marking improvements proposed for the railroad crossing on S.R. 426, east of Pennsylvania Avenue, in Winter Park.

This hearing is being conducted to give interested persons an opportunity to express their views concerning the proposed improvements. Draft project documents and other information will be available for public review from July 30, 2017 to August 20, 2017 at the Winter Park Public Library, 460 E. New England Avenue, Winter Park, FL 32789, Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Friday and Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Sunday 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Participants may provide verbal comments directly to a court reporter before and after the formal presentation. Persons wishing to submit statements, in place of or in addition to oral statements, may do so at the hearing or by sending them to Ashraf Elmaghraby, Florida Department of Transportation, District Five Traffic Operations, 719 S.
