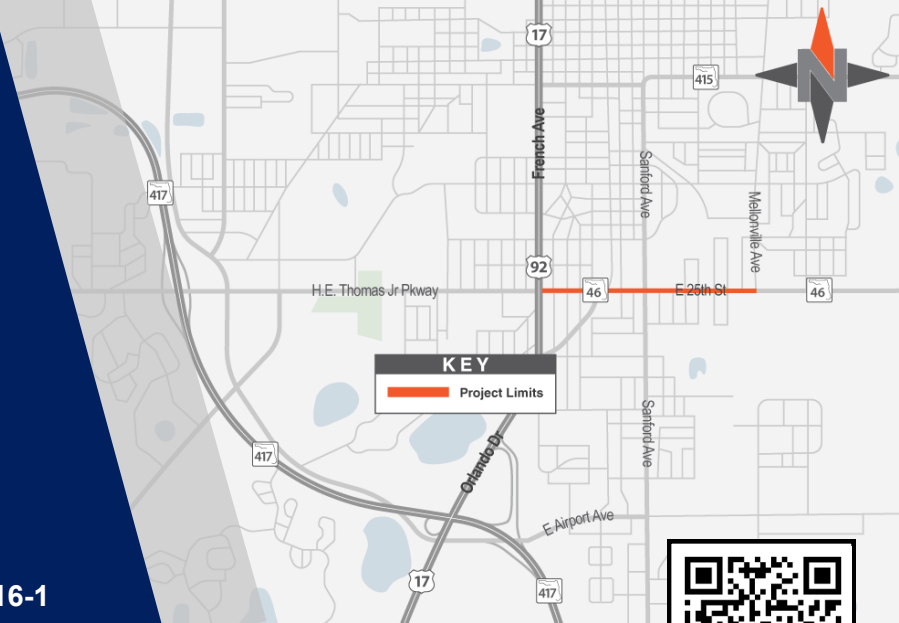




25th Street (S.R. 46) Safety Improvements from French Avenue (U.S. 17-92) to Mellonville Avenue

Seminole County

Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is proposing improvements along 25th Street (State Road (S.R.) 46) from French Avenue (U.S. 17-92) to Mellonville Avenue in Sanford. The goal of the project is to enhance safety for all modes of transportation as well as repave this section of 25th Street to extend the life of the roadway.

Widening the sidewalks on both sides of the road to 8 feet is planned to enhance pedestrian mobility and accommodate bicycles. The wider sidewalks are possible by changing the travel lane widths. The outside travel lanes are planned to be 11 feet wide and the inside lanes would be 10 feet wide. To enhance safety, the project also proposes to construct raised, grassed medians at various locations throughout the corridor. Exact locations of the medians have not been determined.

Other proposed improvements include providing crosswalks and midblock crossings at intersections that do not have traffic signals. Exact locations are still being determined. The project also proposes drainage adjustments and upgraded curb ramps to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

FDOT held a virtual open house from mid-December 2021 to mid-January 2022 to introduce the project and receive community feedback. This typical section is a direct result of that public input, and the plans will be further refined as design moves forward.
