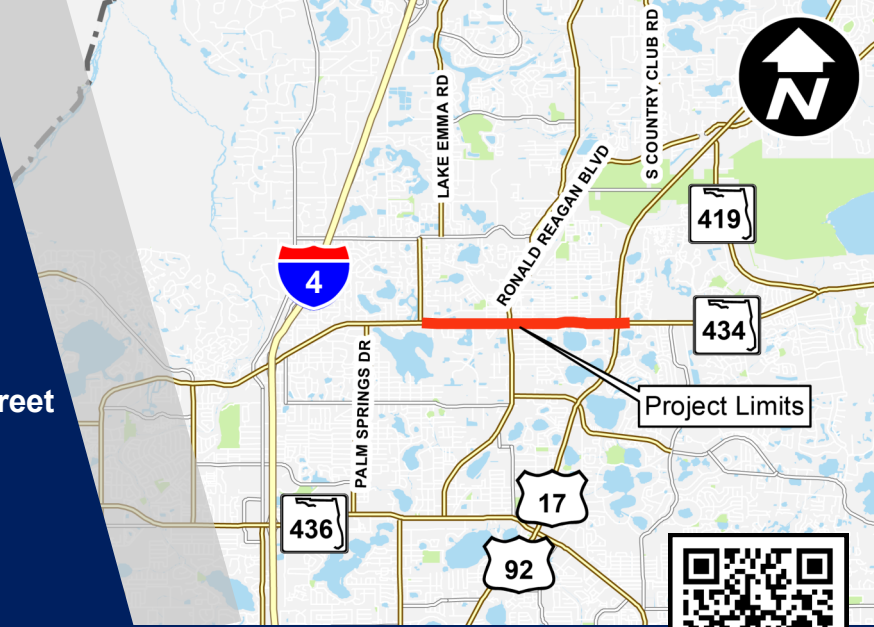




S.R. 434 Resurfacing Improvements from east of Rangeline Road to west of Talmo Street

Seminole County

Project Description

The Florida’s Department of Transportation (FDOT) is proposing improvements along State Road (S.R.) 434 from Rangeline Road to west of Talmo Street in Longwood. The purpose of the improvements is to extend the life of the existing roadway through resurfacing and to enhance safety and mobility for all users. Because of planned Seminole County improvements, a portion of S.R. 434 on either side of Ronald Reagan Boulevard will be excluded. This project will be constructed with the safety project from west of Oleander Street to east of East Street (FPID No. 443838-1).

In addition to repaving the roadway to create a smoother driving surface, the project plans to provide new 4-foot-wide bicycle lanes through restriping between Rangeline Road and Milwee Street. Additionally, some driveways will be reconstructed, and abandoned driveways will be removed to enhance safety along the corridor.

The project plans to also replace the existing grassed buffer with stamped concrete to create an 8-foot-wide sidewalk along S.R. 434 from Oleander Street to East Street. Other pedestrian improvements include lighting enhancements, reconstructing sidewalk curb ramps and upgrading pedestrian signals at intersections to meet current Americans with Disabilities (ADA) standards.
