


Project Description

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is planning improvements to increase capacity and enhance safety along U.S. 17 from south of Spring Street to Lake Winona Road.

The initial project segment from the PD&E Study proposes widening U.S. 17 from two lanes to four lanes and constructing a roundabout at the intersection of U.S. 17 and Spring Garden Avenue/Spring Garden Ranch Road. Three new drainage ponds are also proposed as part of the improvements. The project also includes a multi-use trail from Spring Garden Avenue to Lake Winona Road and a new entrance into the Department of Forestry compound. In response to public comments, the project limits have been extended to allow for the addition of a signal at Ponce DeLeon Boulevard/East Baxter Street.

This project is a portion of the overall project approved in the PD&E Study to widen U.S. 17 to north of S.R. 40. In order to more easily implement the design and construction, the project has been divided into three segments. This project is segment 1. Segment 2 extends from the Duke Energy Substation south of S.R. 40 to north of S.R. 40. Segment 3 plans to widen the roadway from south of Winona Road to the Duke Energy Substation and plans to include a new bridge over Deep Creek, as well as a wildlife crossing culvert.
